● National Science Day, 2022 celebration at Cotton University

The University celebrated National Science Day on February 28, 2022, under the aegis of Cotton University Teachers' Association (CUTA). Some of the important events of the day included an essay writing competition on the theme "From Waste to Wealth: Vision for a Sustainable Future", competitions on Identification of Plants and Identification of Common Fish Species organised by the Botany and Zoology Departments respectively. The competitions were in view with this year's National Science Day theme – Integrated Approach for Science and Technology for a Sustainable Future. An exhibition on Microbial Art, held at the department of MBBT, CU was another major attraction of the day.



The celebrations also included popular talks from eminent personalities namely Professor Kulendu Pathak, Former VC, Dibrugarh University, Professor Parimal Bhattacharjee, Retired Professor and Head of the department of Zoology, Gauhati University, Professor Jibanjyoti Das, Department of Physics, CU involved in science education.



● **Conclave on Atmanirbhar North East through Science and Technology Interventions**

North East Centre for Technology Application and Reach (NECTAR), an autonomous society, set up under Department of Science & Technology, Government of India joined hands with Cotton University, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan and Vijnana Bharati to organise a conclave on Atma Nirbhar North East at the university on December 21-22, 2021. The conclave aimed at reaching out to like-minded students, faculties, scientists and entrepreneurs by providing a platform where they could showcase their entrepreneurial and research traits to the academic community at large. The events of the conclave included technical sessions on start-up ideation, science and technology quiz, ideation on addressing climate change in the Northeast region, heritage through the lens of science, exhibition stalls of various products and a cultural programme by Cottonians. Professor Jagdish Mukhi, Honourable Governor of Assam graced the conclave on inaugural day. ● Report from the Laboratory

Community mobilization and sensitization for freshwater pearl culture leading to entrepreneurship development in Northeast India

Pearl cultivation is a multibillion-dollar enterprise being world's largest aquaculture activity in terms of value. Lack of knowledge and inadequate scientific training inhibits development of pearl culture in the Northeast region of India. Interestingly, all the well known pearl producing mussels (*Lamellidens* spp.) are available in different parts of Assam including (a) *Lamellidens corrianus*, (b) *L. marginalis*, (c) *L. phenchooganjensis* and (d) *L. jenkinsi anus*. The Zoology department, CU has successfully developed an indigenous technology of pearl culture, producing laboratory based biopolymer coated nucleus that produces high quality designer pearls (figure) as compared to conventional nucleus. The Department of Fisheries, Government of Assam has granted some space in Dighali Pukhuri, Guwahati for further validation of the concept in natural environment.

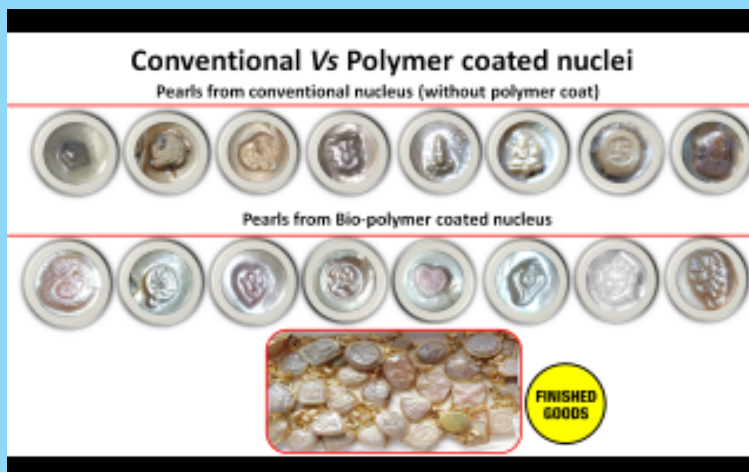


Figure Designer pearls produced by conventional nucleus (top row) and biopolymer coated nucleus (bottom row).
